In 2010, Eagle Scouts from 35 councils participated. In 2011, 88 councils participated. After all entries are received, the Council-level NESA committee selects their winner. From these, regional committees select their winners and, from those four, the national winner is picked. The nomination procedures, deadlines, and award recognition items are listed on the back side of the application.

Scout Master Minute

What is the full uniform in Boy Scouting? What is the full uniform in Troop 726? Is it having all the proper patches on your uniform and sash neatly sewn on and in the right position and orientation? Is it wearing a shirt that is clean and free of wrinkles? Is it wearing the scout hat, scout pants, scout socks, scout belt, and hiking shoes? Is it having clean fingernails, neat and combed hair, a clean face, and good posture? Is it having the Troop neckerchief on with the official neckerchief slide? When is mixing and matching allowed and appropriate?

The uniform is one of the Aims and Methods of Scouting. When you wear your uniform you are representing your Troop, your Council, and the Boy Scouts of America. Because the American Flag is on your uniform, you are representing your country when you dress.

People judge you by the clothes you wear and how you wear them. Scouts also judge themselves by the way they wear their uniform. When scouts wear their uniforms in a neat and clean manner and stand with good posture they show that they have judged good respect for themselves.

In Troop 726 the full uniform is from head to toe with all the proper Troop 726 patches in the proper places





Troop 726 does make exceptions allowing for the Firem'n Chit and Totin' Chip to be sewn on the pocket flaps.

While I understand that it is fun to have a National Jamboree or World Jamboree uniform, it should be understood that the fun uniform is secondary and that every scout should have at least one fully adorned Troop 726 uniform.

To show really sharp pride in his sash, all of the Merit Badges will be sewn neatly in rows and in the proper orientation. Any scout who can look up silly videos on the internet can certainly look up the merit badge image to find out how it is supposed to be oriented. The front covers of Merit Badge books are another resource. These are subtle clues to show how much a scout values his sash.

Of course a sharp looking uniform starts with the individual scout but the high standard is especially reinforced by the older scouts and the adult leaders.


